Investing in the Next Generation

Local Couple Serves Children Through Their Careers, Volunteerism, and Philanthropy

Allie Brooks had planned on a long career in the United States Military. Serving in ROTC at South Carolina State University as he completed his education degree, he had no expectation of becoming a teacher.

However, after an honorable discharge from the military, Allie began serving his country by investing in the next generation. Beginning as a math teacher at Moore Middle School, Allie quickly worked his way up to Principal at Wilson High School, a role he held for three decades. His career culminated by serving as Superintendent of Florence School District One.

“Being an educator gives you the chance to help mold children,” Allie explained. “Being a principal and a superintendent allows you to increase your impact in helping students become productive adults.”

While Allie strived to develop the next generation, Barbara worked to provide specialized and compassionate care for the Pee Dee region as a registered nurse at McLeod Regional Medical Center. With a career that spanned more than 46 years, Barbara also believed in the value of giving back to the community and was a loyal supporter of the McLeod Health Foundation’s Employee Campaign during her years of service.

Through their careers as well as the fact that their three children were born at McLeod, Allie and Barbara know the value of having children’s healthcare available locally. In 2016, they joined other generous donors of the McLeod Foundation to support the

McLeod Children’s Hospital Expansion Campaign.

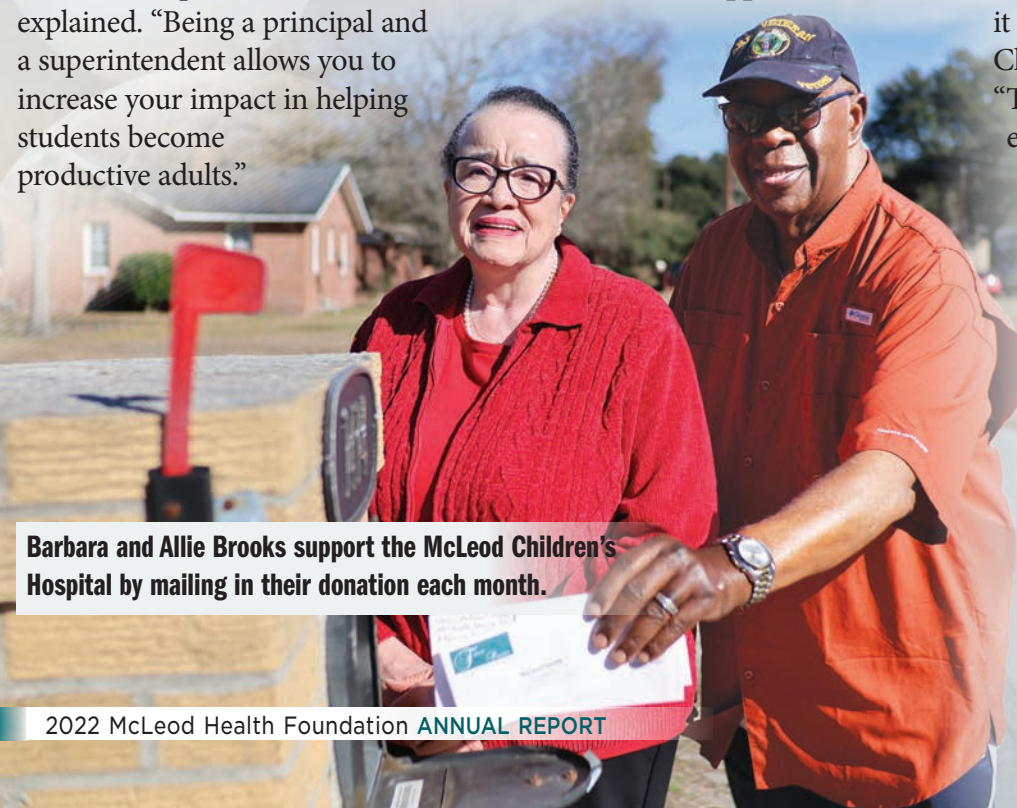
“It is a blessing to have a Children’s Hospital in the Pee Dee,” Allie says. “The services they provide children in our region – from babies no larger than your hand to teenagers – are immeasurable.”

Allie and Barbara are both retired now, but they remain committed to improving the lives of the next generation in our region by tutoring elementary school children and mentoring at risk K-12 students. In addition to a busy volunteering schedule and Allie’s service on the McLeod Health Board of Trustees, the couple give monthly via direct mail to support the McLeod Children’s Hospital.

“The McLeod Foundation makes it very easy for us to support the Children’s Hospital,” explained Allie. “The mailer comes with a return envelope -- we simply place our check inside and mail it back.”

Allie and Barbara’s commitment to bettering the lives of others, particularly the younger generations, is an inspiration.

“McLeod has been such a big part of our life. Among so many worthy causes, we have decided to focus on the McLeod Children’s Hospital because of the need to invest in our region’s children,” added Allie.

Full Circle of Care Guides Giving

From Lifesaving Care Upon the Birth of Their Daughters to Their Mother’s Compassionate End-of-Life Care

For Dr. Joe and Kate Griffin, giving through the McLeod Health Foundation is all about family. Their support encompasses the full circle of life.

In 1991, the couple were anxiously awaiting the birth of their twin daughters. Due to complications, doctors put Kate on bedrest at 21 weeks.

The girls arrived at 27 weeks, weighing just two pounds each. “Dr. Joe Harlan is a saint in our eyes,” shares Kate. “He gave us hope for our precious babies throughout our 90-day stay in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) at McLeod Children’s Hospital.”

One of the twins, Emma, required transfer to Columbia for access to a High Flow Frequency Ventilator. **Following their experience, Joe and Kate made a generous donation to provide funding for this special equipment at McLeod Children’s Hospital in Florence.**

Joe and Kate continued their support of the McLeod Foundation through the years. In 2019, they were delighted to become generous donors to the campaign to build a new NICU. Recently, they visited the new state-of-the-art facility and were emotionally moved to see the lifesaving care that would be

available for struggling infants like their daughters.

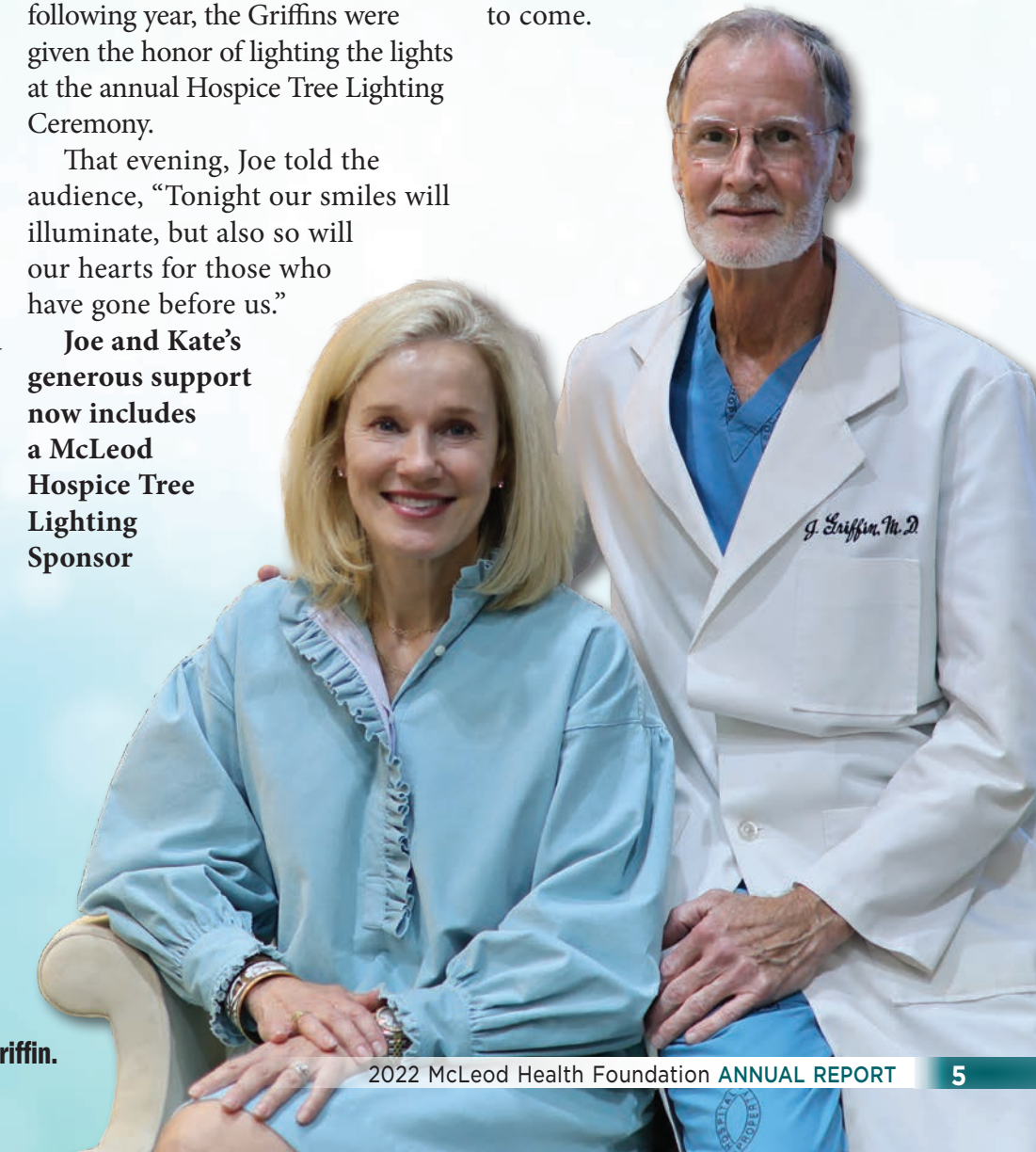
Their support continued in 2020 when Joe’s mother and longtime Florence resident, Allene Griffin, became seriously ill. Fortunately, she was able to receive tender compassionate care in her final days at the McLeod Hospice House. The following year, the Griffins were given the honor of lighting the lights at the annual Hospice Tree Lighting Ceremony.

That evening, Joe told the audience, “Tonight our smiles will illuminate, but also so will our hearts for those who have gone before us.”

Joe and Kate’s generous support now includes a McLeod Hospice Tree Lighting Sponsor

Endowment, which the couple established to ensure support for the Hospice program in perpetuity.

GIVING SPIRIT LEADS LIFE DECISIONS

Dr. Charlie Jordan Follows the Path of Helping Others



Dr. Charlie Jordan's desire to give back to McLeod has included support of the Children's Hospital and Guest House.

Dr. Charlie Jordan's long relationship with the children and families of our region began with a simple conversation. His childhood friend, the late Dr. Bruce White, told him of the tremendous need for pediatric care in Florence.

Dr. White introduced Dr. Jordan to Dr. Julian Price, the first pediatrician in the region who began caring for patients at McLeod in 1928. Dr. Price told Dr. Jordan about the opportunity to build a pediatric program at McLeod. This program would support access to care for children from all over the region.

Dr. Jordan and his young wife, Susan, knew this was his calling. They moved to Florence in 1978 and never looked back.

Dr. Jordan remembers the early days when parents from around the Pee Dee would arrive at the hospital carrying their premature babies in a shoebox. He soon began recruiting pediatric subspecialists and the McLeod Children's Hospital became a reality.

"I was encouraged by donors to the McLeod Health Foundation and Children's Miracle Network who were instrumental in our work," recalls Dr. Jordan. "They helped establish the Child Life Activity Center, the only Pediatric Intensive Care Unit (PICU) in the region, and the first pediatric transport to bring the premature and sick babies safely to Florence."

Sadly, Dr. Jordan and his family became recipients of compassionate care at McLeod when his beloved wife Susan fell seriously ill. During her nearly two years of treatment, Dr. Jordan became aware of the strain acute illness can have on a family. Just as he had done in the past when he saw a healthcare need in our region, **Dr. Jordan generously provided funding for the Guest House at McLeod, another special facility funded by the McLeod Foundation, to support families throughout the region so they could be with their loved one during a healthcare crisis.**

Following Susan's passing, Dr. Jordan joined the McLeod Foundation Board of Trustees, where he was instrumental in the establishment of McLeod Men, a group focusing on men's health. He also led fundraising efforts for the McLeod Children's Hospital renovation campaign.

Recently, Dr. Jordan and his family personally benefitted from the local, specialized children's care he spent his career fighting to achieve. A beloved young family member fell ill with diabetic complications and was rushed to McLeod and admitted to the PICU.

"Dr. Carl Chelen and his team saved our precious child's life," Dr. Jordan shares with great emotion. "If we had to travel hours away for this care, the outcome would have been tragic."

Dr. Jordan and his family will be forever grateful to Foundation donors who have joined him in supporting the McLeod Children's Hospital.

How Dawn Arnette Works to Preserve Medical Excellence for the Future

If you are familiar with hiking and camping, then you probably know the "rules." One is leaving your campsite better than you found it. This way, nature's beauty will be preserved for future generations to enjoy.

For Dawn Arnette, a former Girl Scout and current McLeod Health Foundation board member, this principle of stewardship also guides her charitable giving.

(which support the wide-ranging needs of cancer and hospice patients, respectively).

"Just think of all the lives McLeod touches throughout this part of the state," Dawn said. "God calls us all to serve others with the gifts we have. If I can help support or raise awareness of all the different services McLeod provides, then that is what I want to do."

*SC Federal Credit Union Helps McLeod Provide
a Home Away from Home for Families*

Medical crises are often frightening times for families. This anxiety is only magnified when they are far from home.

To help families facing this difficult circumstance, a dedicated group of McLeod Foundation donors funded construction of The Guest House at McLeod. Since 1995, the Guest House has provided a home away from home for families traveling long distances for their loved one's care, and for those facing sudden medical emergencies while on the road.

Understanding the value of community and hospitality, SC Federal Credit Union has been a generous supporter of The Guest House at McLeod since 2020.

"Credit unions tend to be

locally focused," explained Robert Harris, a SC Federal Credit Union Executive. "So, our support of the Guest House and its patients is a natural fit. When we learned it needed repairs and renovation, SC Federal decided to help financially."

But, it was a recent personal experience that truly drove home the importance of the Guest House for Robert.

Robert's beloved wife, Sandra, was diagnosed with cancer and treated at the McLeod Center for Cancer Treatment and Research. She began telling Robert about the difficulties she heard other patients describing – everyday challenges around accessing transportation to and from treatment. As Florence natives, Robert and Sandra took that for granted.

"I was physically and emotionally drained," Sandra recalled. "I do not even want to think about how much more difficult recovery would have been if we lived out of town and had to travel for my treatment."

With Robert's encouragement, SC Federal Credit Union now contributes annually to the Guest House, ensuring that families receive convenient, comfortable, and safe lodging while facing medical emergencies.

"The Guest House is an unsung hero -- a part of the higher level of service that you expect from McLeod," Robert says. "It really is a godsend for families in need of this special home away from home."

Local Physician Gives Back and Inspires Giving in Others

After years on the move as a traveling physician, **Dr. Raymond Holt** has found a home at McLeod Health. The New York native began working at McLeod Primary Care Seacoast in 2010.

One of the first things that struck him at his new job was

his fellow employees' passionate support for the McLeod Health Foundation.

"My first exposure to the Foundation was seeing others around me filling out the pledge cards to donate," explained Dr. Holt. "I was thinking 'what is this about, all this giving?'"

Dr. Holt was inspired to become a Foundation donor himself. And, recently, he began inspiring others to give as well.

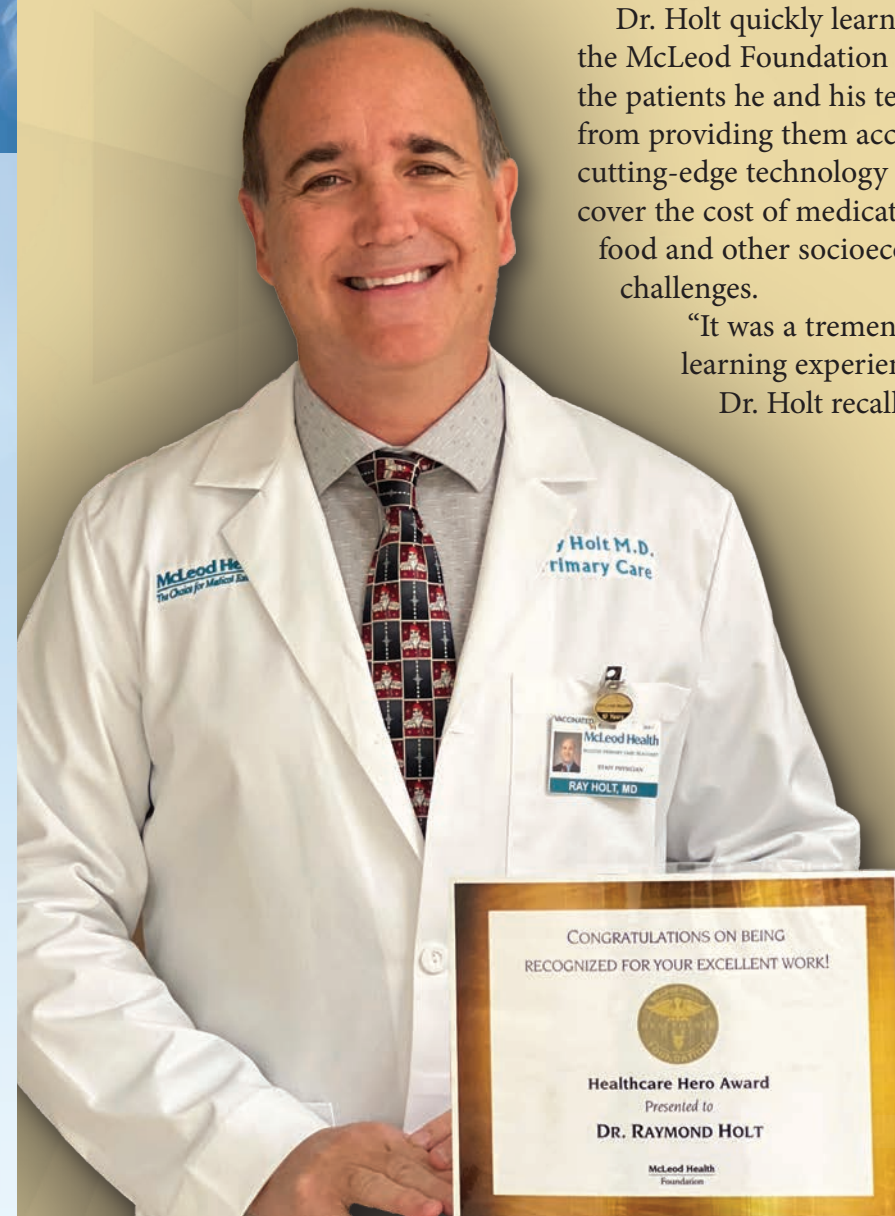

LOSS LEADS TO HOPE FOR THE FUTURE

Robb and Daryn Sasser Commit to Help Patients on Their Cancer Journey

The Sassers have been giving to the McLeod Health Foundation since 1997. But, it was a life altering loss 20 years later that inspired their current philanthropic focus.

Robb's mother and both of Daryn's parents passed away from cancer. The loss of their family members motivated this generous couple to seek out a way to help cancer patients.

Years ago, their good friend Robin Aiken helped establish the HOPE (Helping Oncology Patients Everyday) Fund for patients treated at the McLeod Center for Cancer Treatment and Research. Once Robb and Daryn learned about this special patient assistance fund, they knew immediately this is where they wanted to direct their support.

"Cancer requires everyone in a family to come together to get through it," Daryn explained.

While Daryn's father underwent cancer treatment, he was forced to travel over an hour away from their small town for care. Daryn and her siblings lived hours away and had to determine how he

would be transported. With the help of a compassionate neighbor, he was able to make it to all of his appointments.

"Robb and I quickly realized that the HOPE Fund would fill the gap for those who do not have this kind of support," Daryn recalled. **"Cancer is so debilitating. It is important to help anyone you can."**

The couple began their crusade for the HOPE Fund with a generous gift from Daryn's parent's estate. Later, when the McLeod Foundation launched the HOPE Fund Endowment, it, too, became the focus of the Sasser's giving.

"The HOPE Fund is special because it truly provides human services beyond medical care to those struggling with their cancer journey," Robb explained.

"With my career in finance, we have chosen to support the HOPE Fund Endowment to ensure this care is available in perpetuity."

Believing that McLeod Health is one of our region's greatest assets, Robb and Daryn also give

generously of their time. Both have participated in the McLeod Fellows program. Robb also serves on the McLeod Health Foundation Board and various other committees. Daryn serves on the HOPE Fund Advisory Committee, and volunteers regularly in the Cancer Center.

"We grew up in small towns and both of our families had to travel to larger towns for advanced healthcare," Robb said. **"We have always known that we are blessed to live in a place that has such excellent healthcare close to home."**

While the impact of Robb and Daryn's gifts help those in our region, their thoughts always return to their beloved parents when supporting the McLeod Foundation.

"We are comforted by the fact that the passing of our parents has led us to a legacy of giving back to help others in their cancer journey," Robb reflected. **"We are confident they would approve."**

LOVING CARE INSPIRES GENEROUS SUPPORT

Serving Her Community Through Volunteerism and Philanthropy

Their love story began on a ski slope. It culminated in a 30-year marriage that eventually found them making their home in North Myrtle Beach, South Carolina.

Daryl LeDuc and her late husband, Rich, began their lives together in their home state of Connecticut. They pursued busy careers in architecture and construction while enjoying a second home in North Myrtle Beach. In 2008, the couple settled permanently at the beach and became valued members of the community.

Daryl and Rich were relishing their new life following Rich's retirement in 2019, when Rich began experiencing health problems. As a commercial pilot, he was traveling back and forth to see his FAA Medical Examiner in Connecticut when their future neighbor, **Dr. Timothy Carr**, recommended a primary care physician at McLeod Health Seacoast.

Dr. Carr continued to track Rich's health, which rapidly began to decline. He was on call when Rich came to the Emergency Department and was diagnosed with acute renal failure. Further testing revealed an infection on the mitral valve of his heart. Sadly, Rich experienced complications during his recovery from open heart surgery and passed away in April of 2020.

Daryl recalls the level of care and comfort they received at McLeod. "The mission of McLeod Health is truly meaningful," Daryl said.

"It is very apparent in the network of support provided and the ways in which all team members consistently treat patients and their loved ones with compassion, dignity, and respect."

To repay the kindness and professionalism she and Rich experienced, Daryl has become a dedicated supporter of a number of McLeod Health Foundation initiatives.

In Rich's honor, Daryl established the first Endowed Cardiac Scholarship Fund at McLeod Health Seacoast to assist cardiac patients struggling to afford follow up visits to their physician, medications, and therapy.

Daryl also sponsors the Dine Out for Breast Cancer event to honor her sister, who died of breast cancer, as well as the Jockey and Juleps event.

In addition, Daryl generously gives of her time, serving on the McLeod Loris Seacoast Foundation Board. And, to provide for patients and families in her beloved community for generations to come, Daryl recently included the McLeod Foundation in her will.

"Access to excellent local healthcare, with physicians who are friendly and relatable, is so important," Daryl explained.

Looking for a way to give back to her new community, Jill served as a Candy Striper, a young hospital volunteer that worked alongside nursing staff and, in that era, wore a distinctive red and white striped uniform.

"When I first moved here, I needed to find a community," Jill recalls. "And, I found it at McLeod."

These early years of volunteerism formed an enduring bond between Jill and McLeod. Jill saw every day how important the hospital is to the patients of this region.

"McLeod is a blessing to this area," Jill explained. "It is a constant in this community and

has always strived to take the care of others to the largest scale possible. Helping advance that work became imperative to me."

As her ties with McLeod grew stronger, Jill and her husband, **Dr. Joe Lewis**, a retired oral surgeon, would expand their participation to help McLeod flourish. For many years, they have been active members of multiple McLeod Foundation groups, including McLeod Fellows and McLeod Angels, and Joe's service on the McLeod Men Advisory Committee. Their increased involvement has inspired generous financial support of numerous McLeod Foundation initiatives.

"I love being an advocate for McLeod in the community," Jill explained. "It has given me an opportunity to spread the word of the excellent care McLeod provides to others."

Jill's philanthropic relationship

with the Foundation has seen her support cancer services, cardiovascular services, hospice, and other areas. While each of these causes resonate with Jill personally, she is quick to point out that she simply wants to help where the need is greatest.

"I have not needed specific reasons to give," Jill explained. "I have just always wanted to contribute to worthy causes, and McLeod has consistently been that choice for me."

Jill will also tell you that over her long relationship with McLeod, the blessings have flowed both ways—that serving others by volunteering at McLeod and supporting the McLeod Foundation has enriched her life as well.

"McLeod has increased my capacity to care for others by giving me the opportunity to help them," Jill reflected. "It has truly made me a better person."

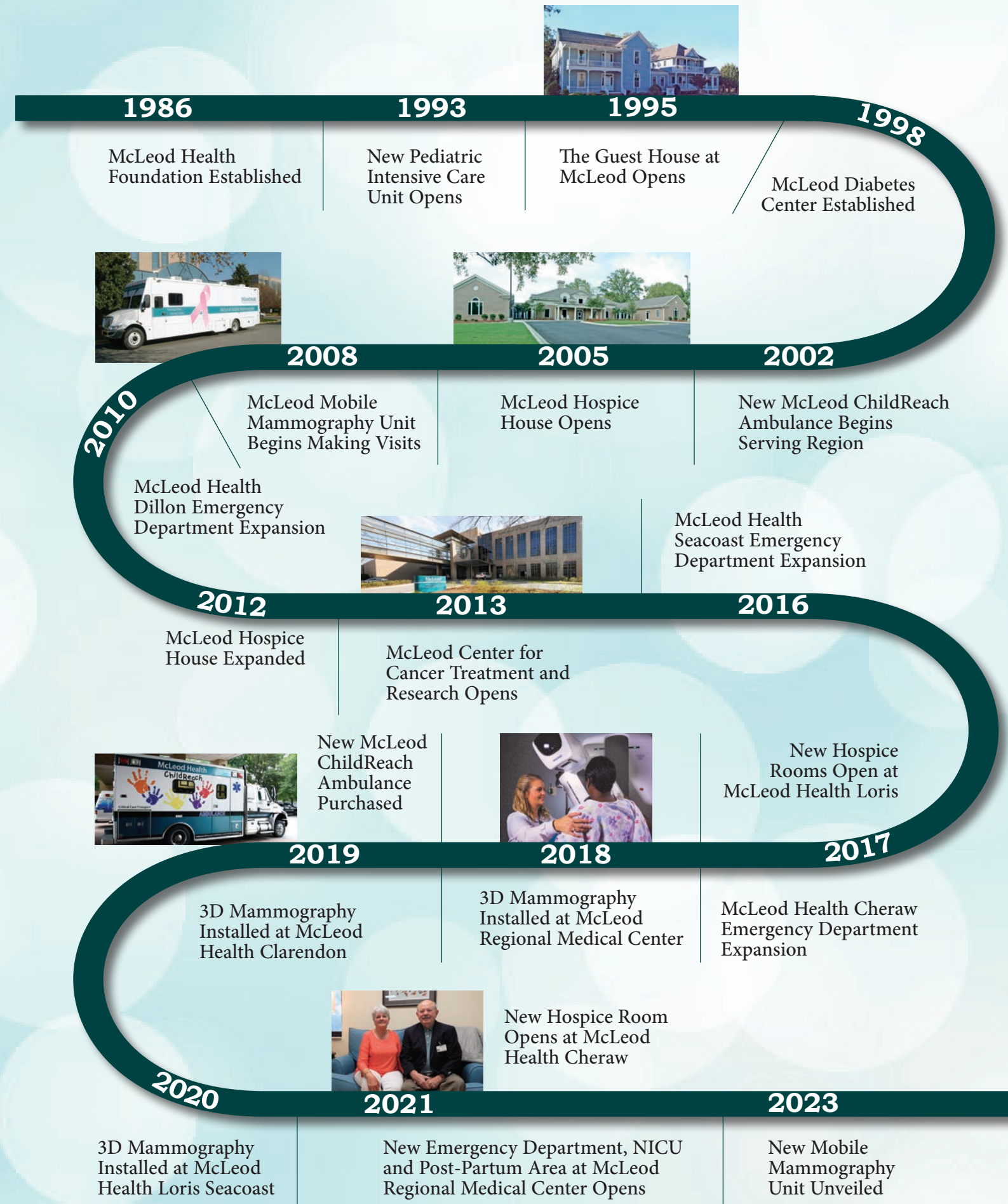

PROVIDING ACCESS TO EARLY DETECTION

*Corporate Foundation Helps Keep a
Vital Service Alive for Women in Our Region*

The Truist Foundation was formed in 2020 with the mission to improve quality of life for individuals living in its communities. The Foundation holds the belief that all people should have an equal opportunity to thrive.

When Matthew Langston, Market President for Truist in Florence, heard about the McLeod Mobile Mammography Unit, he knew it was a perfect fit for the Truist Foundation.

“Access to high-quality healthcare is a critical component

of ensuring all community members have the opportunity to thrive,” Matthew explained. “We believe everyone should have access to mammography services -- early detection saves lives.”

Since 2008, the McLeod Mobile Mammography Unit has provided

breast cancer screenings to more than 36,000 women, traveling to schools, free medical clinics, local industries, and military bases across 11 South Carolina counties to bring these services to women living in rural and underserved areas. The vast majority of those served are working class, low-to-moderate income women who would likely otherwise forgo annual mammograms, finding the prospect of traveling long distances to a hospital too burdensome. **Last year, due to frequent repair needs on the 15-year-old vehicle, the Mobile Mammography program was unable to complete some visits. Generous donors, like YOU and the Truist Foundation, quickly stepped up to fund the purchase of a new vehicle.**

Matthew, a graduate of the McLeod Fellows program and board member of the local

community health center Mercy Medicine, knew how vital it was to keep this service available for the women of our region.

“One of the biggest issues facing our region is access to care,” Matthew said. “Having the mobile unit out in the community alleviates access and transportation issues. Going outside of the brick and mortar fulfills a real need for these women.”

For the Truist Foundation, early detection is not simply a community need. It is also personal. Doris Lockhart, who sits on Truist Bank’s local advisory board, is a breast cancer survivor herself. 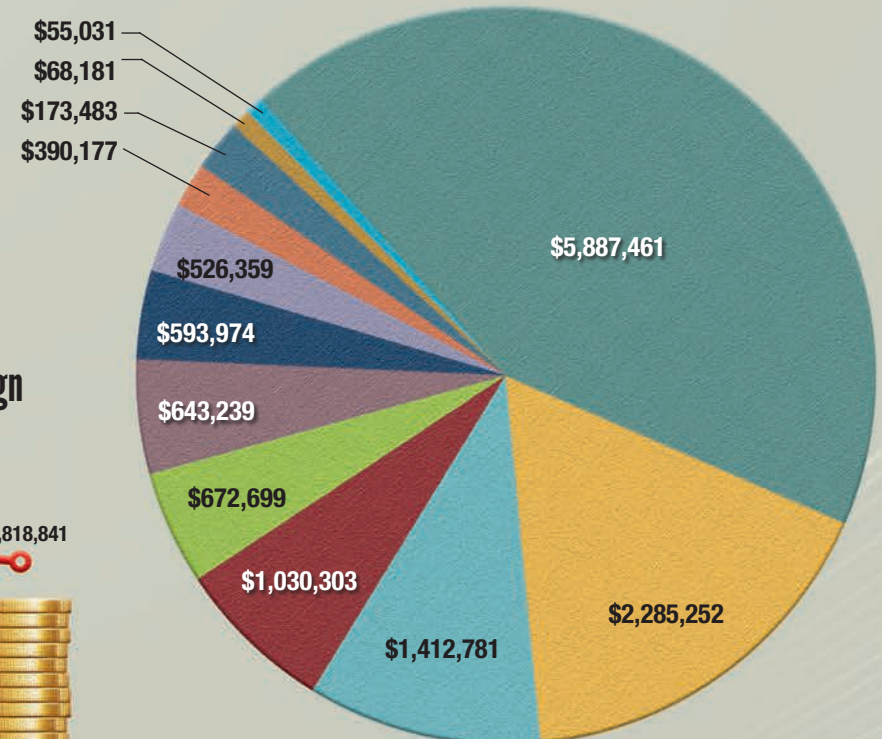

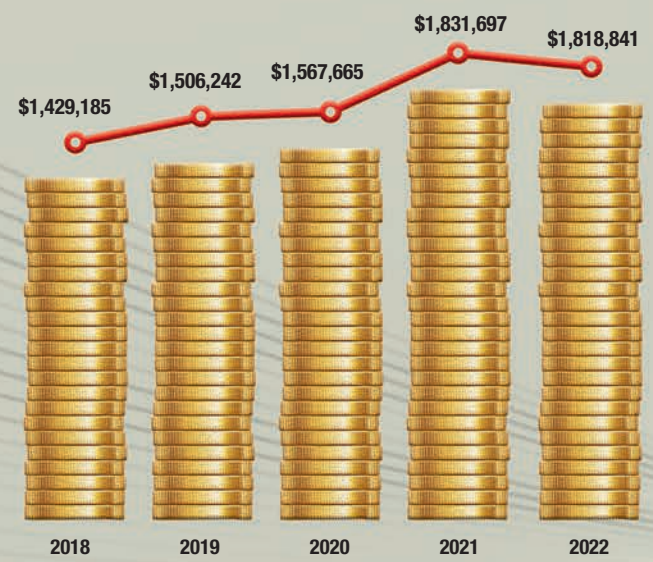
