As part of its ongoing commitment to patient wellbeing, McLeod is pleased to offer access to clinical research trials in a variety of medical fields. We continue to consider new national and local studies that may benefit patients here in our community. The list below outlines many of the research areas and studies in which McLeod Health currently participates.

Blood, tissue, and other biobanking studies, including:

- The Sanderson Study
- Oncocyte PAINTR and CVTx

Oncology – drug trials and registries for certain cancers, including:

- Breast cancer (e.g. NSABP B-58; A011502, The ABC Trial)
- Leukemia (e.g. A041202)
- Lung cancer (e.g. A151216, The ALCHEMIST Trial)
- Multiple myeloma (e.g. S1803, The DRAMMATIC Study)
- ...and many others through the NCI CIRB network

Resident research (student-driven studies and quality improvement projects) in the following areas:

- Pharmacy
- Family Medicine
- Dosimetry

Humanitarian Use Devices (HUDs*), including:

- PK Papyrus® Covered Coronary Stent System
- Spiration® IBV Valve System

*HUDs are medical devices that are intended to treat patients with certain rare diseases or conditions (i.e. those that affect no more than 8,000 people in the U.S. annually). While the IRB, in conjunction with the FDA, reviews HUDs to ensure medical validity, these devices are not “investigational” and are not part of research studies at McLeod.
